ORDINANCE NO. 1-14

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE PARKING OF  
MOTOR VEHICLES, MAKING IT UNLAWFUL TO  
PARK IN CERTAIN PLACES AND UNDER CERTAIN  
CONDITIONS AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR  
THE VIOLATION THEREOF

AND NOW, this 25 day of November, 2014, the Supervisors of Pleasant Township, Warren County, Pennsylvania, do hereby enact and ordain as follows:

**SECTION 1:**

It shall be unlawful for any person to park a motor vehicle in Pleasant Township, Warren County, Pennsylvania:

- A. In any area in which is posted with a "No Parking" sign;
- B. In any area which is designated as a "Bus Stop" space;
- C. Upon a cross-walk, whether or not so designated, and whether paved or unpaved;
- D. In such manner as to block a driveway, either public or private;
- E. In such a manner that the parked vehicle faces oncoming traffic;
- F. Within fifteen (15) feet of a fire hydrant;
- G. Within twenty-five (25) feet of an intersection of streets, highway or roads;
- H. With all or a portion of the vehicle on a Township road surface.

**SECTION 2:**

Enforcement hereof shall be by an action before a District Justice in the same manner provided for the enforcement of summary offenses. The Board of Supervisors hereby set a criminal fine in the amount of Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00) per violation, and the costs of prosecution, and, in default of payment of such fine and costs of prosecution, to undergo imprisonment of not more than thirty (30) days, provided, further, that each day's continuance of a violation shall constitute a separate offense.

**SECTION 3:**

This Ordinance shall become effective five (5) days after the date of its adoption and shall be deemed to repeal and replace the certain Ordinance adopted by the Supervisors of Pleasant Township on September 13, 1958.
